The start of a new school year holds promise for each of us. Our ability to build upon the progress we have made in three short years as an independent school is something I look forward to seeing come to fruition.

Three years ago, DLSA was still in "start up" mode, with various departments not yet established. I am happy to report that we have grown tremendously. We have an academic support program to ensure more students' needs are being met, along with counseling and graduate support programs that ensure we are more effective in holistically accompanying our youth from 5th grade through college. In order to continue on our path to sustainability, the Philanthropy Office supports community outreach and guides our efforts to fund our work for years to come. Reflecting on these additions to our scope of services and programs brings about such gratitude.

Our school theme this year is **Partners in Mission & Inspiration**. There is a palpable commitment to our mission that is embodied among all our shareholders: students, staff, families, graduates, trustees, donors, and volunteers. Because of this, I am confident that DLSA will take significant steps in achieving its vision of creating even more equitable opportunities for Academy students and graduates to achieve personal and academic success.

Now in our 9th year, we have 63 alumni in high school, along with 29 college-aged alumni. Last school year, our enrollment was 67 students. For the first time ever, we have enrolled <u>72 students</u> (the maximum building capacity)! This is truly a sign that so many in our community are sharing our story and inspiring new families to connect with us!

From improving our writing curriculum and assessment methods, to expanding the scope of our counseling and social emotional programming, there will be much to highlight in the year ahead. I am impressed by the faculty and staff's commitment to innovation.

The DLSA student is the most important person on campus. We create opportunities and inspire students to achieve their goals. In turn, our team is inspired by the transformation we see in them.

Get to know Ms. Weinberger

A: I appreciate being close with the families and students. I can tell they are grateful for the work that I do. Also, seeing students improve their confidence and ability to advocate for themselves is rewarding.

Q: Our President keeps highlighting 100% staff retention. How do you see that benefiting the students, families, and staff at DLSA?

A: 100% staff retention creates essential trust in our school. Community and relationships are so important to our work, and the familiarity will strengthen the work we are trying to do.
