Students who are accepted into SEO Scholars receive the equivalent of 2.5 years of additional English & 1.5 years of additional math instruction. This helps them close the academic and opportunity gap and graduate high school with the skills necessary to tackle college with confidence!

DLSA is finding more ways to connect with our students, families and local school partners. A special thank you goes to Esther Lopez, Co-Director of College Counseling at De La Salle High School, who approached Mr. Cisneros about the SEO Scholars program. Ms. Lopez encouraged a number of our qualifying 2020 DLSA graduates to apply. We are excited to announce that our very own

have been accepted! This is the most acceptances Ms. Lopez has ever seen in her years at DLSHS! Being an SEO scholar means these DLSA alumni are part of a program that features:

- O 100% of S.F. scholars admitted to a 4 year college; 75% are attending schools ranked in the top 100 according to a U.S. News and World Report
- O 90% graduation rate
- O Dual enrollment: Take college courses during summers
- Mentorship--College application guidance & Financial Aid Assistance

Our Graduate Support Program will work closely with these scholars as they continue to embark on the journey to attend college. We are proud of their hard work and look forward to having more of our graduates in similar programs.
