WHO WAS ST. MIGUEL FEBRES CORDERO?



Francisco Febres Cordero (1854-1910), was the first Christian Brother to come from Ecuador. On February 9th, DLSA celebrated his feast day and honored him by recognizing his outstanding dedication to teaching and his life with a school Liturgy. As one of only nine schools in the country with the Lasallian San Miguel middle school model, DLSA has focused on connecting our students with the life of San Miguel.

At the age of nine, he became one of the first students at the school opened by the De La Salle Christian Brothers in 1863. But writing and teaching secular subjects was not his primary joy-- his first love was guiding students in their faith formation.

At DLSA, we honor him and all of our Brothers who serve and dedicate their time, energy and love to those around them. We also offer our prayers of support and solidarity with our fellow San Miguel schools across the United States.
